We believe in celebrating children's successes and recognise that each child is an individual, with their own personalities, interests and talents.

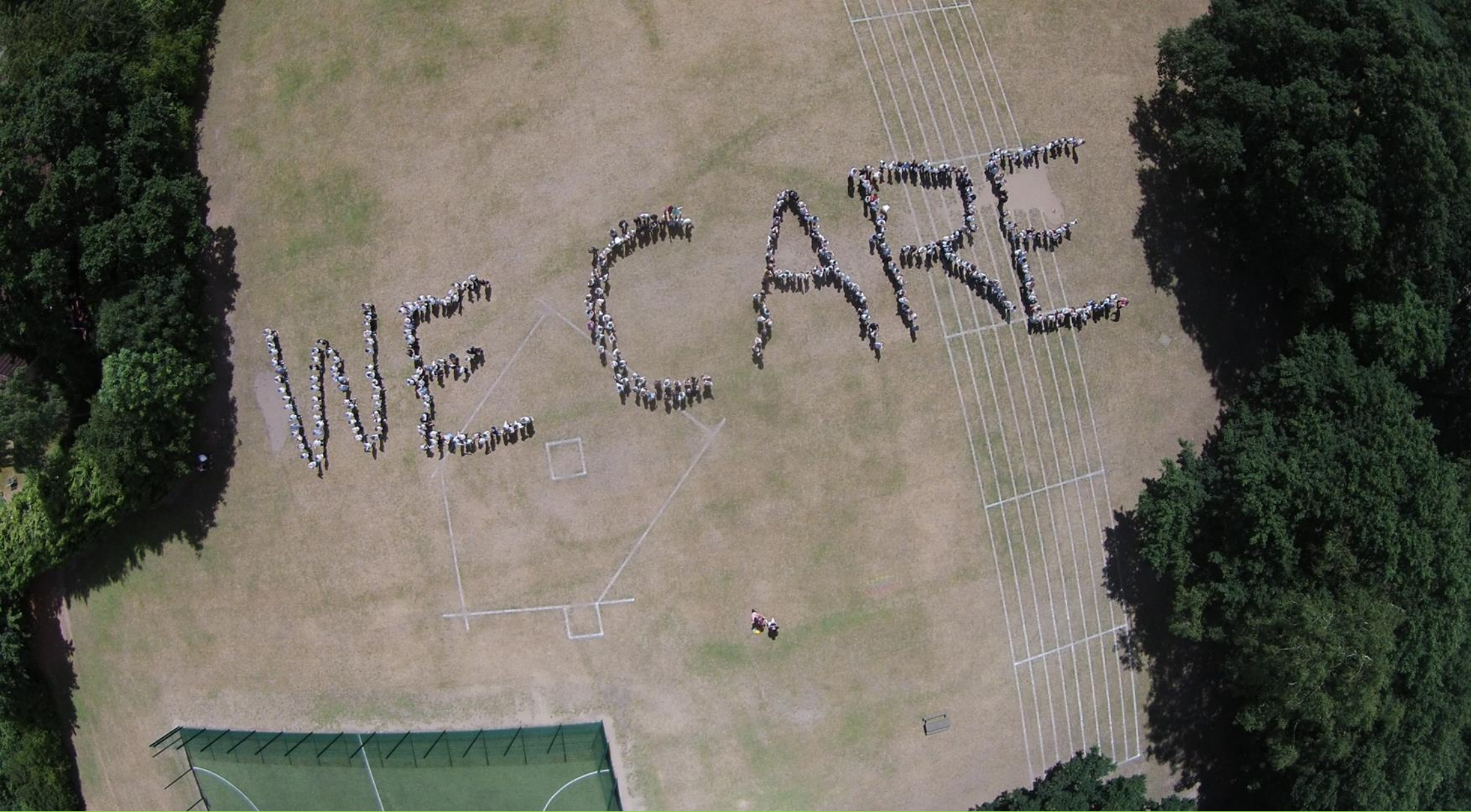

We are proud of our rich and broad curriculum that delivers high quality learning in line with the National Curriculum.
Our Teaching aims to inspire our children through dynamic and innovative learning opportunities.

Curriculum aims

A curriculum that:

- Fosters children's curiosity
- Is inclusive and accessible
- Builds and extends on prior knowledge
- Uses relevant and real life contexts
- Is flexible to meet children's needs and incorporates current topics in the world
- Is engaging to make learning enjoyable
- Develops cross curricular links to enhance learning, where relevant

Teaching aims

Our teaching will:

- Create a safe environment which fosters and encourages independence, a growth mindset and values making mistakes
- Use effective questioning to provoke thought and reasoning
- Tailor provision to support and stretch, including the use of concrete resources leading to pictorial and abstract approaches to suit each individual
- Develop and embed "We Care" skills to support an effective learning environment and to nurture lifelong learners
- Demonstrate a secure knowledge of the relevant subject and curriculum areas whilst capturing and maintaining pupils' interest in the subject
- Make use of formative and summative assessment, give pupils regular feedback to which they respond to, to secure pupil progress
- Foster teachers who reflect systematically on their practice, effectively plan subsequent lessons and strive to continuously improve outcomes for all

Enrichment Opportunities

We believe in offering as many opportunities as possible to develop children's talents and interests across the curriculum.

Pupil Voice Groups

We value the opinion of all our children and promote pupil voice groups to support the school in its continued development.

We have an active School Council, voted for by the children and they are involved in many aspects of school life linked to teaching and learning. We also have a Wellbeing Ambassador group who take the lead on supporting children with their mental wellbeing.

Our House Captains are also a key pupil voice group and they are nominated by their Teachers for being role models in demonstrating our school community values.

Sports Clubs

Our range of sports clubs are enjoyed and well attended from children in each year group. We have a very popular netball and football team but also we offer a wide diverse range of other sporting clubs such as rugby, hockey and dance to encourage our children to stay active as possible both in and out of school.

Musical Events

Choir runs most weeks throughout the year and we ensure the choir perform as often as possible, both within school but also off-site. As well as the option to purchase additional music lessons there is the annual family choir day. All children have performances that are part of their curriculum but children can also be part of our fantastic and very popular whole school productions.

Gardening Club

We are so lucky to have an amazing volunteer who runs our Gardening Club. Our garden is well worth a visit and the team of children who tend it do an amazing job!

Our School Community

Before and After School Club

As part of our caring ethos, working families are well catered for through our breakfast and afterschool club provision. Set within our school, this ensures children are familiar with their surroundings and continue to be happy, confident and safe within a welcoming environment. The majority of our staff also have roles within the school during the day. This ensures a fantastic transition for children and great consistency in routines; enabling children to build on relationships that are already formed and for us to provide an excellent continuity of care. Children have fun and enjoy socialising with children from across the school whilst engaging in a range of fun, play based activities. Activities range from construction to arts and crafts and there is something on offer for everyone.

Additional Support

Our SENCo (Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator) is a non-class based teacher who oversees our provision for pupils with special educational needs and disabilities. We have a team of support staff who are deployed to facilitate small group work as well as one to one learning and this dedicated team works closely with the class teachers and with families. The SENCo is happy to talk to parents about how the school can support their children and will facilitate support from outside agencies where appropriate. Our SENCo also works closely with the manager of the Speech and Language Centre which is based at the Hiltingbury Schools.

Our trained ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) provides individual or small group emotional or social support to children. They are able to help children learn to understand their emotions and respect the feelings of those around them. They provide the time and space for pupils to think about their personal circumstances and how they manage them.
