Message from Miss Loosemore

Dear Parents and Carers,

On Monday during our INSET day all staff contributed towards two of our school priorities for this year. To start the day we all joined in a team building session led by Mr Wright as part of our staff wellbeing strategy. The favourite challenge, that we know the children enjoy too, was building the tallest structure to hold a balloon using only marshmallows and spaghetti! You can see our achievements below! Mrs Hartley then led a training session developing our practice in the effective use of guided groups within the classroom. In the afternoon, our subject leaders all participated in a 'Teach meet' which is a short presentation held by Teachers to work together for professional development. Each subject Leader shared the vision for their subject, the National Curriculum links and their aims for the children's knowledge and experiences by the end of year 6. These have been informed by our Subject Leaders working with Staff from both the Infant school and our local Secondary schools. I have included some of the examples of this too which we will be using to support the development of our new curriculum. If you would like to hear more about our curriculum subjects Miss Bristow will be leading the next Parent Forum meeting about Geography on Monday 20th March 2023 at 2pm.

We welcomed the children back on Tuesday and they all had many exciting stories to share about their half term break. After lunch they then had their important part to play in sharing their ideas about the curriculum. The children were able to voice their opinions about which people they would like to learn about in the world, what experiences they would like to have at school, what technology they would like to use and apply across different subjects and what knowledge and skills they would like to learn. A few favorite topics came from our existing curriculum such as the Stone Age and going to Warner Brothers Studios and some new ideas were learning about famous explorers, having the opportunity to do more cooking and visiting London as a school trip.

A very popular event we have coming up at the end of the term is our school DISCO! We know how much the children enjoyed the previous one and we were able to raise a lot of money for the Helpful Hounds charity which we are hoping to do again so please put the date 23.03.23 in your diaries.

Thank you to all of our parents so far who have signed up to Arbor and downloaded the app. Mrs Batten, Mrs Rose, Mrs Bailey and Mrs Gowland are all very pleased to share that 81% of the school community are now up and running! They are looking forward to using the Arbor app for the first time soon to open Parents Evening bookings. If you are one of the 19% who have yet to download the app and complete this sign up please do so as soon as possible!

To celebrate 'World Thinking Day' children from across the school came dressed in their uniforms from a variety of Cub, Scouts and Girl Guide divisions. Mrs Chapman wrote to me to say that the children were very proud to be able to do this and explain to their friends about their uniform and what they do at their unit meetings.

- •Been introduced to French in a way that is enjoyable and fun, using songs/games etc;
- •Fostered an **interest in learning other languages** at KS3 and beyond, becoming **curious** about how languages work;
- •Become aware of (some of) the cultural differences between the UK and Francophone countries;
- •Grown in their **confidence** to speak in French, working on their fluency and refining the precision of their pronunciation and intonation, and having the skills to find different ways to communicate what they want to say;
- •Become confident to **engage in conversations**, asking/answering questions, expressing opinions, responding to others and seeking clarification/help where needed;
- •Had the opportunity to present ideas/info orally to a range of audiences.
- •Developed a growing bank of French HFW in their long-term memory, which can be applied in different contexts/topics.
- •Used their understanding of French **phonics** to decode (writing/reading).
- •Developed their confidence to **write phrases and sentences** (using a scaffold &/or from memory) and adapt these to create new sentences.
- •An understanding of the basics of French grammar, e.g. conjugation of high frequency verbs, word order in sentences, fem/masc forms etc.

By Year 6, children at HJS will have...

- Listened to, analysed, explored and performed a wide range of music from a breadth of eras, cultures and genres.
- Experienced high quality live performances.
- Performed music in front of an audience.
- Developed their vocal skills to be able to perform part songs with confidence.
- Learnt how to play an instrument, using musical notation.
- Improvised and composed using a variety of different components.
- Become increasingly independent in making creative choices.

We are delighted to welcome you to our **Book Fair on the 1st and 3rd March 2023** at Hiltingbury Junior School.






