Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week, two year groups enjoyed the school's first Virtual Reality experience as a result of Miss Bristow's organisation. The children's faces and 'oohs' and 'aahs' while they were interacting and exploring their virtual world really had the impact we had hoped!

We would like to say an enormous thank you to our very committed Sports Leaders who are doing a fantastic job of leading games at lunch times. Over the past few weeks, they have undergone training with Personal Best Education sports company, learning a range of sporting activities whilst developing team work and leadership skills. This week, we have seen lots of children joining in and enjoying the sports leader sessions - the parachute is a definite favourite! It is great to see the leaders growing in confidence and we look forward to seeing their skills develop over the rest of the year. Well done sports leaders - you are doing an amazing job.

Our sporting achievements continued out of school as well and we were delighted to take one of our netball teams to Thornden yesterday to take part in a tournament. Our wonderful 9 did a superb job in an adapted netball game, due to the weather. Earlier this week, we hosted another coffee morning. Local yoga practitioner - Liz Dodd - showed us the many benefits of yoga for both parents and children. We also had a go at seeing first hand the many brilliant ELSA and Thrive-based activities on offer for children at school to support their emotional and social needs.

As part of Neurodiversity Celebration Week the children explored 'Celebrating our unique strengths and differences.' Through both the whole school assembly, using the text 'We're all Wonders' and then having the opportunity within their classes to ask questions, the children learnt to recognise and respect that we all think, learn, interact and perceive the world differently. 

Parent Governor Vacancy

We have a vacancy on our governing body for a parent governor which we are now looking to fill.

Hiltingbury Junior School has always aimed for a partnership with parents, which undoubtedly brings great benefits to the children. One of the most significant ways you can help in promoting this aim is to volunteer to be a parent governor. The governing body's main tasks are:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Holding the executive leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation and its pupils, and the performance management of staff; and
- Overseeing it's financial performance of the organisation and making sure its money is well spent

Parent governors are welcomed as valued members of the team and play a vital role in ensuring the governing body are aware of the views of parents and the local community. We meet as a full governing board twice a term and also have a number of subcommittees and working parties. The meetings take place within school at varying times of the day / evening.

We welcome applications from candidates with a passion for getting the best outcomes for our children along with the commitment and time to devote to the role. Previous governance experience (in any sector) or finance/ HR knowledge would also be desirable. Training and support will be available to help you develop into the role. This will include an induction programme, in-house mentoring and support as well as access to external governor training.

Mrs Clarke - ELSA - I particularly enjoyed the yoga with Liz, and the acknowledgement that even giving ourselves a few moments, to simply breathe and to stretch, our bodies and minds are so grateful, and this can make all the difference in the busiest of days.

Re the art therapy, giving your child and yourself some new art resources to freely express themselves can be so relaxing, especially with some gentle music playing. Enjoy the flow of the paint, for its own sake without judging whatever shape or design you create.

Mrs Boden - Thrive practitioner: I enjoyed creating a relaxing environment, to explore and talk to parents about the activities that can help us support our children. We need time to listen to our own bodies and time to relax too.

Mr Wright - Mental Health Lead: Enjoyed the yoga, as a different form of physical activity from his usual sports; as well as the therapeutic benefits of playdough, putty and the weird magic of mixing cornflour and water to form a sensory material!

Mr Wright also mentioned the fact that a smaller group facilitated chat between parents and staff, the importance of this, and the fact that it's always good to talk to school staff if you have any concerns about your child.
