To bring the week to life, we owe a huge thank you to Darius Rad, Verity Emmans, Neil Coleman and Preeti Sahota who came in to share with the children how their careers *connect* to Science. Making connections to Careers!

This week is British Science Week! One of the ways we have been celebrating was by hosting some visitors to talk about their jobs and how they are related to science, and how ambition helped them to succeed in their role.

We met a clinical pharmacist, a children's orthopaedic surgeon, a Senior Manager for Open Access Performance and an Energy and Innovation Manager and they all were amazing.

Verity Emmans, who worked for Open Access Performance, was brilliant and talked to us about who her inspirations were (Rosalind Franklin and Marie Curie). It was really interesting to learn that scientists don't just have to be the people that use chemicals and that they can be people from surgeons to engineers! Verity said that she published scientific journals and explained how it worked and she showed us journal which link to the Science topics we study in school.

Darius Rad, the children's orthopaedic surgeon, told us how he helps children with broken bones by putting a cast on and sometimes he puts a metal bar between the broken bones to support it. He even showed us some x-rays which was very inspiring!

Neil Coleman, who works in renewable energy talked about one of his projects making fuel from cow poo! It was amazing to think that his job didn't exist when he was at school and that there are so many different ways you can use Science in your career.

Finally, Preeti Sahota, the clinical pharmacist, talked very passionately about her job, and we really benefited from her. She said that Science and ambition are related to her career in many ways, including from making pills all the way to understanding her patients. Mrs Sahota also told us that she was interested in the heart and making people well from an early age. Besides that, she said that she enjoys talking to patients and that there is something in her profession called the golden minute when pharmacists let the patient speak about what is important to them!

All of our visitors were an inspiration to us all.

Making connections in the classroom!

In class this week, we looked at our fingerprints and the Science behind them. We worked out if we had loops, whorls or arches in our prints. We scribbled a bit of charcoal on a piece of scrap paper, used sellotape to take our fingerprint and then examined them. They were all different and in our classroom there was a mixture of all the fingerprint patterns. We really enjoyed doing this and thought it was cool we were doing the same thing that the police do!

Did you know?

- Fingerprints don't change with age.
- Fingerprints are actually hard to lose. Skin damaged by washing too much, cuts or even acid regrows with the same fingerprint as before the damage. You can't escape your fingerprint!
- The pattern of your fingerprint is not determined by your genes so twins do not have the same prints!
- The animal that has fingerprints that most closely resemble the human fingerprint is actually the koala!

This week many of the children have been working on team games in PE. I have seen entire classes of children, linking hands and navigating PE equipment, with care and communication, to ensure that every child is included and the course is complete as a shared experience. I have also seen smaller groups carefully work their way around a course, with one member blindfolded and putting their trust in the physical and verbal guidance of other group members. The children were thoroughly enjoying these opportunities and it will have strengthened bonds and built the reality that we all need each other, particularly during challenging times.

Please talk to your child and discover if they did this activity, what it felt like, what they learned. Maybe recreate the experience using sofa cushions/beanbags, or take turns blindfolding yourself and your child, to see if the other can direct you towards a different part of the house. (Using common sense re potential safety risks!) A fun experience for growth, trust and bonding, which will automatically feed wellbeing.
