Message from Miss Loosemore

Dear Parents and Carers,

An enormous thank you to our brilliant HSPTA team, other volunteers and everyone who came along to support Spooks and Sparks yesterday evening. As always, the event was superbly organised with lots of activities, stalls and a great firework display to keep the children entertained. Above all though, it was again so lovely to hold another event during which our community could come together – thank you again to everyone.

Staff started this half term with a training day in which we joined the infant school to participate in further safeguarding training delivered by Hampshire. This was really informative, contributing further to maintaining our strong safeguarding culture at Hiltingbury. During the afternoon, we focused on our school improvements for 'the quality of education'. Our research led training enabled us to reflect on and explore how children learn, specifically thinking about how to maximise active learning opportunities and the way on which adult guided groups support and challenge this. It has been exciting to see the impact of this training develop across the school this week.

We were delighted to welcome the children back to school on Tuesday – we heard all about the exciting things they had done over half term, but their highlight had certainly been Halloween. Our school council delivered an excellent assembly following their learning review of our 'working together' skills – our learning skill in focus for this term. We heard about some great improvements that have been made with some specific next steps as we continue build on these improvements throughout Autumn 2. Thank you to Miss Chambers in supporting the school council with this.

A real highlight this week have been both our year 3 and 5 school trips to enrich their curriculum. Year 3 visited Hilliers gardens as their hook into their Stone Age unit – the children had a great time and were excited to tell me about making wood and string stone age bracelets, clay houses and even fire. As part of their geography unit - a view from space, Year 5 visited Hiltingbury Lakes to develop their field work skills. They enjoyed carrying out some mapping, sketching and motif designing activities.

Another big thank you to Mrs Thomas, our brilliant school librarian, and our pupil librarian team who each picked a poetry book from the school library to rehearse over half term which they then read to lots of enthusiastic children who visited the library at lunchtimes – it was a special moment when the children broke into spontaneous applause at the end of each poem.

A key part of our safeguarding curriculum this week has been for the children to watch an NSPCC assembly during which they were reminded of key child protection messages and the childline phone number. Every public library in Hampshire offers a warm welcome to all members of the local community. Inside our buildings families can find:

- Warm and vibrant children's area
- Magazines and books for adults
- Books for all children, including teenagers, in their own part of the library
- Free WiFi
- Free public computers
- **Printing and photocopying** (available for a small charge)
- Boardgames and jigsaws
- **Welcoming library staff and volunteers** - who will all be wearing an ID badge, so they are easy to spot
- **Free Rhymetime sessions** which support communication and language in the early years. Also an opportunity to meet other parents/carers
- **Free storytime sessions** for toddlers, younger children and school-age children
- **Free construction club sessions** where children can play with building bricks
- Free craft and colouring sessions, where all the materials are provided

Some libraries also have special tables, with a quiz, game or puzzle, where you can sit if you want to have a chat with someone. You can bring cold food, snacks, and drinks into the library too.

We also offer a range of free courses just for parents and carers and places for people who enjoy the same hobby, like knitting, colouring, or jigsaws, to sit together and talk.
