We will then investigate the addition and subtraction of mixed numbers and improper fractions		Our next unit will focus on introducing decimal tenths and hundredths to extend the children's understanding of place value.			
Science	We will recap our knowledge from Year 3 on the functions of teeth and then explore the processes involved with the digestive system.		Initially the children will have the opportunity to explore constructing circuits using bulbs, batteries and buzzers. Investigations will include what is a conductor and an insulator before creating their own switch for their circuit. This aspect will be linked to creating a security device for an Ancient Egyptian exhibit.			
History	We will conclude this unit by investigating the legacy of the Anglo Saxons and the changes from Paganism to Christrianity. The children will further investigate whether Alfred was worthy of the title of being great?		The children begin our Ancient Egyptian unit with exploring chronology and what was happening across the world during this period. They will further explore the impact of the River Nile, daily life and the hierarchical structure of this civilisation. Activities will include making inferences using artefacts and mummification. Tutankhamum, tomb robbers and the Ancient Egyptians' beliefs in the afterlife will also feature in this unit.
