Message from Miss Loosemore

Dear Parents and Carers,

This half term really does seem to be going very fast for us in school and we continue to be proud of all of the children's achievements both in and out of school. This week our curriculum has continued to offer all children exciting opportunities for them to engage in their learning. This was especially true for year 6 who visited Harry Potter World. The children all represented the school brilliantly and were respectful throughout each day of visiting. Exploring the behind the scenes of the movies and participating in a workshop learning about special effects really inspired and sparked so much curiosity from the children. It truly was a fantastic trip. The children will now use their experience to support with their new writing unit. Thank you to all of the staff and governors who accompanied the children and enabled this opportunity to go ahead. Each trip does take a lot of organising but the outcomes are always worthwhile!



George (6C) This week George has been asking a plethora of questions about our learning and has amazed me, and the class, with his depth of knowledge about WW2



Year Group Highlights

Year 3 This week, we have started writing our fable, The Hare and the Tortoise. Children are being encouraged to add some imaginative detail - without deviating from the original version. The main foci are writing in sentences that make sense, with correct full stops and capital letter and using compound sentences (please do ask your child to tell you what a compound sentence is).

Linked to our English, we have started our Sun and the Wind dance unit in our PE lessons. This week, we have explored how to express different types of weather through movement.

In Maths, we have progressed onto 3 digit numbers in our Place Value unit. Across the year group, the teachers have been impressed with the children's knowledge of the 10 x table. Next week, we will progress on to the 5x table. This has been set on Times Table Rock Stars for your child to continue to practise at home.

A gentle reminder to listen to your child read at least 4 x a week and record this in their reading record. Please remind your child to bring their record in to be checked every Thursday. For those children who have been allocated a resource library by our teaching assistants, please could they read even more regularly at home.

Spelling homework in Year 3 begins this Friday. Have a wonderful weekend in the sunshine.

Year 5 - It has been another fun-filled week in Year 5 this week. We kicked off our week with online safety and a discussion about social media apps and the reason for their age limits. This proved a really insightful conversation and it was great to get the children discussing the right steps to follow, alongside developing their understanding of what the age limits actually are for the different apps they might have heard of. Our DT project continues and our Mayan Dolls are now really taking shape. This week we have enjoyed paper and pasting and painting them so they are ready for their clothing fitting! This was truly a great opportunity to witness the children's teamwork and to see everyone working together to ensure all the dolls were finished on time. May we add that the children also showed themselves to be brilliant at tidying up too!!! In other areas of the curriculum, we have continued our English unit all about the Unsung Hero, specifically writing a letter as the little girl in the clip to thank the man for the impact he had on her life. The children have been working hard to use the present perfect tense and to start their sentences with subordinate clauses - we have needed plenty of ambition to help us! As well as this, we have been enjoying rocking out to music as we complete our times tables and we have continued to develop our understanding of place value with numbers up to 1 million.

A final message from us - Thank you so much for supporting your children's reading at home. We ask that you please sign their reading record ready for checking on a Thursday, as this really helps us to develop a full picture of your child's reading habits. Thank you and have a great weekend!

Year 4 - This week has seen some exciting new topics start in Year 4 land. Firstly, the launch of our BFG unit in English, based on the book by Roald Dahl. This has long been a favourite of Year 4 teaching staff and past generations of Year 4, but for this year the learning journey has been refreshed and revitalised in the light of our ongoing development of the writing curriculum. We have been impressed by the work the children have produced so far in response. Another first came in maths when we began our exploration of 4 digit numbers. We start by ensuring the children have a really solid understanding of one thousand and how it can be composed of ones, tens and hundreds. We will now be going on to examine 4 digit numbers more generally in order to understand their place value. We also had our first tennis lesson led by a real tennis coaching professional. After a fun warm up, tennis balls were soon flying all over the playground. Watch out Emma Raducanu!

Finally, just a reminder that it is so important that the children practise their tables each week. Times Tables Rock Stars is a great way to do this as it closely mimics the set-up of the government Multiplication Check the children will be doing in the summer term. Please do ask if your child has lost their login.

Year 6 - Without question, our absolute highlight of the week, term and probably year so far has been our trip to Warner Bros Studios which has kick started our Fantastic Beasts and Harry Potter writing unit. A big thank you to all of our adult helpers who made the trip possible but above everything, an enormous thank you to our year 6's who were impeccably behaved throughout the whole trip, representing Hiltingbury so brilliantly. Here are some specific highlights from each class.

6B had a wonderful day at the Harry Potter studios and were really inspired by what they saw and heard. Here are some comments from the children: 'I have loved learning about the behind the scenes for the films, it was great to see the process of creating the amazing films and the actual props used by the actors.' 'It was incredible to walk down Diagon Alley.' 'Hearing about the time, effort and cost put into creating each individual prop was fascinating.' 'I enjoyed finding out how the subtle and simplistic details could tell us so much about the character. For example there are buttons going down the sleeves of Snape's cloak to suggest he was concealing something.'

One of the children stated that his favourite part was looking at all of the different wands and which character they belonged to. Meanwhile, another child said he loved seeing all of the different props in the workshop, particularly as they were the genuine props used in the films. "To be able to see and look closely at these props was incredible - I felt like I wanted to be in the movie myself!"

We are now looking forward to seeing the writing outcomes throughout this 'magical' unit!
