As a school we have been exploring 'Resilience', one of our school community values. Across the half term the children will be learning about resilience through different subjects within the curriculum. This started with Mrs Carroll, our Art Leader, using the medium of art to share how building resilience can help us all deal with difficulties that we face in our daily lives. 
Year Group Highlights

Year 3 have impressed us all with their enthusiasm in beginning at the Junior school. The children are picking up all the class and school routines that can be a little overwhelming, but, so far, they have taken all this into their stride.

Monday was an induction day and on Tuesday, we enjoyed a day of art - creating abstract trees in the style of the Russian artist Kandinsky, whilst focusing on the school value of resilience. From Wednesday, we have started our curriculum lessons: maths (Place Value), English (writing a letter, inspired by the book 'Dear Teacher') and science (Light). Today, we have started our Games units - hockey = 3D, netball = 3P, team games = 3DN.

Have a lovely weekend. Your child may be rather tired – just as we are after an exciting week!

Year 5 It has been so lovely to welcome the children back to school this week and they should be very proud of themselves for making such a super start. We are certainly proud of them! Our week began with the challenge to create a memory with chalk and we enjoyed a beautiful sunny afternoon working in teams to create large scale designs on the playground. The children's creativity and teamwork was a joy to witness! We have included some photos of the impressive designs they created. This artistic focus continued on Tuesday with a day exploring our community value Resilience through the story of 'The Hugging Tree'. In Year 5, we focused on the American contemporary artist Sally Trace and produced our own tree-inspired art work using her bright, bold colours and line detail. The finished outcomes were beautiful! Hands on learning has been a theme throughout the week, with the children also starting the wonderful process of turning plastic bottles into Mayan dolls. Thank you to everyone at home for your support in helping your children be ready for this project. We could not have done it without you! In amongst all of this excitement, we have also started our new Maths and English units too - more on these next week! We wish you all a restful weekend and look forward to another exciting week next week. 
Year 4 -Dragons have kicked off our new term with some wonderful art and writing activities which the children have loved. Monday saw an extremely busy day as the children in response to the story 'The Dragon Machine' made their own clay dragons with a little help from some instructions and a step by step guide. Once the clay had dried a little, the children painted them with their own range of magical colours before adding a background and a label giving instructions for care and where to return if found! Tuesday was just as exciting as the children were inspired to create their own tree art using cotton wool buds and contributed some thoughtful ideas on their own resilience after reading 'The Hugging Tree'. Wednesday, continuing our theme of dragons, saw the introduction of our poetry unit inspired by the book, 'The Trouble with Dragons' and so far the children have written some sentences reflecting on the views of the troublesome dragons but not without recognising the key message of the importance of our special planet. Hopefully the children will be able to tell you about ways we can protect our planet. We have begun our Place Value work in maths, looking at email in computing and states of matter in science. Google Classroom has been set up, so please do check for this week's spellings homework. Year 4 have also been to the library this week so hopefully they will be keen to share their books and do lots of reading this weekend.

Year 6 -Well, what can we say? - What an absolutely incredible start our brilliant year 6's have had! We have simply been blown away by their enthusiasm for each and every task they have completed, along with their impeccable manners and consideration for each other.

On Monday, we launched year 6 by introducing the children to the overview of the curriculum, and creating our own Fantastic Beast masks ahead of our next writing unit and trip to Warner Bros Studios. We saw lots of creativity with this activity, as the children used a range of techniques including splatting, dotting, smudging, blending and shading. The creativity continued for a second day when we explored our community value of resilience, creating our own tree paintings inspired by Jill Neimark's story, 'The Hugging Tree' and the artists in focus: Nick Blosser and Gustav Klimt. The children have of course really enjoyed meeting their new teachers, generally just starting year 6, and being back with their friends after the holidays.

As we have got in to the swing of the full curriculum, we have enjoyed reading and exploring the prologue to Helen Creswell's 'Moondial' and we are looking forward to imitating the author as a we write our own setting descriptions next week. We were even able to go on a virtual walk around the grounds of Belton House in which the TV series of Moondial was filmed.

Tag rugby has been a real highlight and the children have also been highly engaged in maths as they practised reading and writing numbers, in digits and words, up to ten million. Well done Year 6 – what a brilliant start to the year!
