

An update from the Junior Road Safety Officers!



In the UK speeding is still a major problem. It causes needless crashes, untold suffering and stops people living safe and healthy lives.

Driving is unpredictable and if something unexpected happens on the road ahead – such as a child stepping out from between parked cars – it is a driver's speed that will determine whether they can stop in time and, if they can't stop, how hard they will hit.

We cannot control other drivers on the road but we can make sure that we do our best to keep ourselves safe. During

Road Safety week, in a fortnight's time, the children will be reminding themselves of the Green Cross Code and the importance of wearing bright and reflective clothing – so as to be most easily seen both during the day and in the dark.
